Here at Uppingham C of E, we thrive to ensure that all children have access to high quality PE and physical activities during curriculum time as well as participating in extra-curricular activities. We appreciate the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of our children and believe it has a positive impact on concentration, attitude and achievement.

What is Sports Premium?

Since 2013-14, the government has been providing funding for schools to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The money goes directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. From September 2017, each school receives £16000 plus an extra £10 per pupil each year for children in Years 1-6; the money received can only be spent on sport and PE provision.

Our Sport Premium Funding for 2017-18 is: £17,530

Objectives:

- To improve the provision of PE at Uppingham C of E with increased engagement of pupils in regular physical activities.
- To continue to increase and participate in competitions to a high level.
- To broaden the range of sports and activities available to pupils.
- To increase participation of pupil premium children in sport and physical activity.
- To improve the provision of Well Being across the school.
